"This 11th hour, 180° change in U.S. policy could sabotage years of positive collaboration and progress in brokering an international agreement—capable of U.S. Senate ratification—that ends plastic pollution, unlocks innovation and accelerates a global transition to a circular economy.

"We can eliminate plastic waste without eliminating plastic production for essential goods and quality-of-life-enhancing applications. AFPM looks forward to working with policymakers to develop real solutions that do what the United Nations intends, specifically, keeping plastic pollution out of the environment."
